HOW DID GEOGRAPHIC, POLITICAL, ECONOMIC, AND SOCIAL FACTORS IMPACT THE GROWTH OF SLAVERY IN THE NEW WORLD?

Columbus and Slavery

- Exported Indians as Slaves
- Encomienda System
- Portuguese Traders bring African Labor to supplant dying Native Slaves
- Spanish Priests try to protect Natives, but not Africans

Colonial Slavery

- Most come from West Africa
- -sold by coastal tribes/taken from interior
- -40% die coming in from interior
- 50 Million Africans die after being enslaved during 17th & 18th Centuries
- Of 10-15 million to come, 400,000 come to North America
- -20% die during Middle Passage
- -Horrific conditions, chained by neck and extremities
- Sold at auction ports Charleston, Newport
- Most come after 1700
- -rising wages in England slows Indentured Servitude
- -Royal African Company loses monopoly
- -Bacon's Rebellion
- Half of Virginia's population is slave/2 to 1 ratio in South Carolina

Slave Codes

- Africans grow in numbers/whites feel threatened
- -All blacks are property
- -No literacy for blacks
- -Conversion to Christianity does not merit freedom
- Inherit black codes from Barbados-Spreads to other colonies / Stono Rebellion
- Color line is drawn

Slave Life

- Harsh in South/Less Harsh in Middle Colonies
- -Brutal on indigo and rice plantations
- -Need constant fresh slaves due to high death rate & over use
- Tobacco in Middle South less deadly
- -Plantations are smaller, closer together
- -Field hands, house servants, craftsmen
- -Afforded slaves more contact with friends and relatives
- -Increase in females made family life possible
 - -Increase slave pop through birth rate/no marriage
- Slave culture is a mix of American and African Traditions
- -Gullah-blend of English and several African languages
- -Banjo & Bongo introduced
- -Ring shout dances Leads to Jazz Music
- -Religion combo of Christian and African rituals
- -Afterlife is better than present life

Slave Rebellions

- Stono Rebellion
- -causes call for stricter controls
- -Barbados Codes introduced
- -Spain offers freedom to slaves in Georgia
- -Slaves kill 25 whites, massive retaliation
- -Some rebellions later (Nat Turner, Denmark Vesey), but white reaction prevents most rebellions due to harsh punishments
